Warm greetings, and we sincerely hope this message finds you well.

On behalf of the OLA Sisters and the entire Techimantia community, we would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to the SMA Solidarity Foundation for your generous support towards our school project. Your contribution of €5,073.03 (equivalent to GHS 88,850.00 at the time) has made a significant and lasting impact on the lives of the children we serve.

Project Context

Techimantia, as presented to you, is a rural farming community in the Ahafo Region of south-central Ghana, with a population of over 2,000 people. Many families live in conditions of poverty, as subsistence agriculture often does not adequately meet their needs.

For the past 7–8 years, the OLA Sisters have been working in the area, focusing on education, literacy, and the empowerment of women. Due to the inadequacy of the initial temporary structures and limited classroom space, a permanent school facility was constructed to accommodate approximately 200 children from Techimantia and nearby villages.

This development prompted us to seek your assistance, to which you responded positively.

Motivation and Needs

The project aimed to improve children's access to quality education and literacy, thereby enhancing their ability to integrate into a more responsive and supportive socio-cultural environment.

Activities Carried Out

Following the receipt of funds, materials required for the construction of doors and windows were procured. These were successfully installed in the new classroom block, completing a critical phase of the school infrastructure.

Results Achieved

The installation of doors and windows has greatly improved the learning environment. The classrooms are now safer, more secure, and conducive for teaching and learning. Importantly, children are able to attend classes regularly and study effectively even during adverse weather conditions such as rain and cold. This has already contributed to better attendance and an overall improvement in learning outcomes.

The project commenced upon receipt of the funding and was completed within the planned six-month period.

The direct beneficiaries of this project are approximately 200 children between the ages of 5 and 10 from Techimantia and surrounding communities.
